Together we have over 115 years of experience. We love to help others with their sewing projects. With both of us retired from the medical field, our passion for our customers is a priority for each of us. Our customers are fantastic and will also help us help someone struggling with a project."

We have been learning as we go. Each of us had other business adventures prior to buying the shop. AJ mentored Laura-Jean for several years on how to order, pricing, displays, etc. Laura-Jean has been teaching beginner quilting for more than 10 years. Tammy has just started to teach and is our Panel Queen.

Laura-Jean has 4 children, and a service dog Bella. Her daughter Rachael helps out whenever we need her. She has been invaluable at helping us with our Facebook page. Tammy is married and has 4 children. Tammy's husband has worked tirelessly to remodel the stockroom and classroom. He has also made several items that we use throughout the store. We are so lucky as our families continue to encourage us.

The shop has been located at 6230 W. Houghton Lake Dr. in Houghton Lake, MI for many years. It has been several different types of shops but has been a quilt store prior to 2017 when AJ bought it. for our wide variety of wide back material. We offer many services like long arm quilting. We also offer many different levels of classes and have a free motion long arm we rent by the day. We both are very passionate about quilting and love helping others learn the craft or improve their skills along with ours.

We have a "Sharing is Caring" closet where we collect quilts for veterans, and foster kids and Toys for Tots. We also collect old magazines and books; fabric and any items related to quilting from people who no longer need or want them. New quilters or anyone who is working on donation quilts can take whatever they need from the closet. We love the community we are in and love to help out anyway we can. In the future we would like to grow and be more active in the community.
